SENATOR WESELY: Okay, essentially, it returns to the bill the original language which is what is presently in the statutes that one of the branch facilities has got to be within three miles.

SENATOR KEYES: Three miles of what?

SENATOR WESELY: Of the original bank, the main bank.

SENATOR KEYES: Of the original bank boundaries where it is chartered from?

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR KEYES: Now last year I put an amendment on a bill that went across and passed very nicely. It says that you can charter a bank in a county. So now with your amendment to this, I would be able to go charter a bank within the county and then I would be able to set my teller facilities where?

SENATOR WESELY: This bill also has language in there that would limit any auxiliary facilities within the city limits.

SENATOR KEYES: But the bank that is chartered within the county, where will it limit its facilities?

SENATOR WESELY: I don't know. I can't answer that question. I would imagine it would have to be within the county. This is more for within the cities and city limits. I can't answer that question, Senator.

SENATOR KEYES: If you are chartering a bank here and you are going to say that they can have one within three miles of the city limits, the zoning of the city? Would that affect....

SENATOR WESELY: No, no, not within three miles of the city limits but within three miles of the main facility.

SENATOR KEYES: All right. Then I would be able to take and charter a bank in the center of Sarpy County because I can charter a bank now within the county and using the county population to set the financial status of it. So if I can do that, then I will be able to go three miles beyond the county? I want to know where I can go, three miles beyond the bank or three miles beyond the county?
