

\$420,000, \$480,000, ideally they will be cutting down some mileage so maybe there will be some saving. It costs money, no secret about it, but the other side of the coin. Should a public employee, should a state employee, whoever he or she might be, should they have to subsidize state government. They didn't necessarily ask to be using their car or their vehicle. They didn't ask to drive. They didn't ask to do this, but as part of their job, it probably comes into play, they have to go here or there. They had to pay for that car. They have to pay for the insurance. I don't think you should take this most fundamental part of all and say, hey, look, if you want the job, you have got to kick in from your own pocket and pay for the travel. That should be a state or local government responsibility when they require the public employee to do it. I pointed out the sheriff's thing, the twenty-four cents. I think there are super valid reasons for this. I told you about it is an emergency vehicle. It is out there usually sitting there idling, the lights going, at an accident scene or whatever. He is not getting paid anything for that gas he is running through the tailpipe during that time. If the accident was, well, in a typical county, if the accident was seven miles out on a county road and seven miles back, that is fourteen miles. So what is he going to get. \$3.50, \$4, and he is going to go out there, maybe spend an hour with his car running pulling people out of tangles, so on and so forth with probably a 400 cubic inch engine, I learned that from some kids outside there, with a great big engine going and burn and blowing that gas out. What do you think one of those cars burns in an hours time? So there is a legitimate reason for the twenty-four cents for them. They are not making money. They are probably losing a little. I urge you to adopt the amendment and I know Senator Warner legitimately and sincerely is probably going to offer to cut it dramatically so I guess I urge you to adopt the amendment and then maybe reject any cuts.
