what I am saying is that this amendment seems to be pretty comprehensive and at this point I am not prepared to oppose it or support it, so I am suggesting that the bill be laid over and I would ask unanimous consent that the bill, LB 863, be laid over until tomorrow.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is that 863 be laid over. Passed over until tomorrow, Senator? Okay, is there objection? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, Mr. Speaker. I would just as soon go ahead with it today. If Senator Lamb would like to see amendments to it later on that is fine. I would be happy to work with him. I am not.....I don't have an open and shut mind as to exactly what these amendments should be although I think they are in the best form right now. But I would...I don't think they are so comprehensive that people can't read through them and understand what is going on today.

SENATOR LAMB: I would move then that the bill be laid over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is that 863 be passed over. Senator Vickers, your light is still on, do you wish to speak to that motion? Senator Merz, your light is on. Okay, the motion is that 863 be passed over. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Lamb. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Call of the House and a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. One, two, three, four, five.... Senator Goodrich, Senator Lewis, Senator Simon, Senator Cullan and Senator Schmit are excused according to my record. Is that right? Okay, the Clerk is authorized to take call-in votes. Meanwhile, we need to bring legislators to their seats. Mr. Sergeant at Arms. Mr. Wilson.

CLERK: Senator Kahle changing from no to yes.
