

probably be what is known in the circles as a green card, or a petition that has been submitted to the Immigration and Naturalization Service for resident, permanent alien status. When a student comes into our country right now, Senator Vickers, he will be issued by our foreign consulate... by our foreign consulate he will be issued a student visa. That is called an F-1 Visa, and that visa itself is indicia that that student is here for temporary purposes only, and he does not intend to make this country his home. Okay, so...

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, Senator Johnson, I understand that.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay.

SENATOR VICKERS: I am aware of that. You are using up my time, so, okay, you can make that point in closing if you will. Another question I would have of you is, how then in your opinion does Section 1 of that same section where we are dealing with a student perhaps from Iowa that comes over here that has to stay here 180 days before they become a resident as opposed to the alien student...now how would those two....does this alien student get instant residency, or do they have to be there 180 days first?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, there is a difference between Section 1 and section 5, Senator Vickers, in that under Section 1 a natural born must live in the state at least 180 days as part of establishing his intention to be a permanent resident of the state. Whereas, under Section 5 with my amendment, a comparable 180 day showing would not have to be made, but as I will explain in my closing it probably would always be present.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, now, fellow members, I have a little bit of interest and a little bit of knowledge on this situation. I have two sons that went to Iowa State. I know a little bit about out of state tuition. I also have a little knowledge of the aliens since my sons bought a trailer house over there and one of their friends that lives with them is from Lebanon, the country of Lebanon. It seems what we are doing here, quite simply my sons could not establish residency in Iowa because they came home whenever they had a break. They did not go over there and stay their period for 180 days straight. Whenever they had an opportunity to come home, being an average college student away from home, they came home, and obviously they did not intend to make Iowa their permanent place of residence even though they own a home over there. Consequently, they paid out of state tuition. Now, what Senator Johnson is indicating is that with his amendment we are going to allow a foreign born
