The way I interpret the rules, as long as you stand right at your place, that is fine, but if you are wandering around either gathering up votes or something else, that is a violation of the rules and the Chair must stop the procedure to allow the legislators to get back to their seats. I hope that answers the question. If it does not why you can let me know. Now, what is before the House?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers moves to amend the committee amendments to LB 304. (Read Vickers' amendment as found on page 923 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, Mr. President and fellow members, I just....

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised.

SENATOR VICKERS: ...don't want to leave the impression that I am not feeling for the aliens that are in this country, the refugees that Senator Johnson was trying to address a while ago. Neither do I think that Senator Johnson was unfeeling for the problem as I pointed it out a while ago. By striking the words "naturalized citizen" and including in there "permanent resident alien" then we include the people that have the green card that Senator Johnson was showing...if they have the card that shows that they are going to become a permanent...the desire to become a permanent resident of the United States. They have not been here long enough to apply for a naturalized citizenship, however. That is a different card than the student visa that the people that I was describing earlier hold, however, the ones that intend to go back to their home country. Now, I offer this amendment in an effort to satisfy the problem that I had with Senator Johnson's amendment, and I would hope that Senator Johnson would address it because it takes care of my concern and I think it takes care of his concern also, and I would urge the body's adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Landis, do you wish to speak to the Vickers amendment? Senator Dworak, do you wish to speak to the Vickers amendment? Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: It seems to me the issue we are debating here is what and when people have the right to full citizenship, and I don't think that is an issue of this Legislature.
