CLERK: Mr. President, we now have pending the committee amendments as offered by Senator George's Urban Affairs Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President. Am I on there?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR GEORGE: I will move the adoption of the committee amendments and now we can go in an orderly way as we normally discuss bills on General File. Number one is the committee amendment, which is a rather minor one. As you can see, we simply strike a phrase "menace" and insert "detrimental". It is simply a matter of language. I move the adoption of that committee amendment. I would also propose in order to, if we have an orderly discussion that we would take up the Fowler amendments next because they do further narrow the bill and would possibly eliminate any discussion on things that we might cut out at that time.
