LB 892, 842

892 as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Senator Clark, are you taking the next bill, 842.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 842, title read. The bill was read on January 21. It was referred to the Public Works, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by the Public Works Committee. The Chair recognizes Senator Clark to handle the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: I would move for approval of the committee amendments. What we did in the committee amendments was on page 3, after the comma, on line 7, we struck the remaining language of the underscored language. What that would have done was given them year around permission to do this and that is what we did not want to do. This bill was only designed to take care of the wet grass, stuff that compacts very, very heavily in the garbage trucks, and that is only in the spring, so I would move for the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of the committee amendments as explained by Senator Clark to LB 842 vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The committee amendments are adopted. Now, Senator Kelly, what would you like to do with the bill?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I feel as though I am getting one year's work done in one day and I have just been advised by my coach, Senator Newell, from Omaha to keep this short and I certainly will. LB 842 as amended would allow garbage trucks to haul garbage out of the City of Grand Island, Hastings, Kearney, North Platte, Scottsbluff, any first class city, without getting a weight ticket from the Department of Roads and it is a good bill. I move its passage.
