PRESIDENT: Any further discussion then on the Maresh amendment? If not, Senator Maresh, I guess that constitutes your close, so the question is the adoption of the Maresh amendment to the committee amendment on LB 637. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to amend the committee amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Maresh amendment...the motion carries, the Maresh amendment is adopted. Read the next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Reutzel moves to amend the committee amendments as follows: (Read the Reutzel amendment as found on page 992 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, all this does is put back the original language. The committee amended it to put it on the primary ballot at the request of Senator Maresh and we ran out of time last week. The deadline was the 28th of February to put it on the primary ballot. This would only put back the original language to put it on the November ballot.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the Reutzel amendment to the committee amendment? All right, Senator Reutzel, I guess that will constitute your close. All those in favor of adopting the Reutzel amendment to the committee amendment vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Reutzel's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The Reutzel amendment is adopted. Now anything further?

CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Now we are on the committee amendments as adopted. Anything further, Senator Reutzel?
