SPEAKER MARVEL: Your time is up.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are two amendments on the Clerk's desk. The first amendment....the Clerk will read the first amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to amend the committee amendments. In the Standing Committee amendments on page 1, line 7, after the word "act" insert "that serves no lawful purpose for the person committing the act". Mr. President, that is found on page 699 of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Read the amendment again, Pat.

CLERK: (Read Haberman amendment.) That is on page 699, Senator.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: It is my understanding, Mr. President, and fellow legislators, and it has been explained to me that this language is put in there so that picketing will not come underneath the bill, that it cannot be construed that picketing is an unlawful assembly or that any of this pertains to picketing. That is the reason for that amendment, and that is what I was told. I ask that you adopt the amendment.
