SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, will you record? Senator Lewis, will you record your presence? Senator Nichol, will you record your presence? Senator Pirsch, will you record your presence, please? Senator Kelly, will you?

CLERK: Senator Powers is voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Can't hear. Senator Wagner, would you record your presence, please?

CLERK: Senator Burrows voting yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Voting on the Maresh amendment to the bill. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Maresh, I think I would...(Gavel)...the Chair cannot operate until we have some kind of cooperation from the membership. I think that those of you who have committee hearings scheduled the rest of the week, I hope you can keep them to a minimum, that we can work around one committee being gone assuming that others won't be gone. It is almost impossible to operate when there are a dozen or more who are absent. So I hope you can keep your committee hearings at a minimum. Otherwise you simply stop the operation in the Legislature. Now have you all voted? Okay, Senator Maresh.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp changes his vote. He changes it from no to yes.

SENATOR MARSH: Patrick, voting no.

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House, committee members, the motion before the House is the Maresh amendment to LB 619. Do you want to read the amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh moves to amend: (Reread Maresh amendment found on page 1007, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me, Senator Maresh, will you please indicate to the committee members who just came in exactly what you are trying to do with the amendment.

SENATOR MARESH: Yes, Mr. Speaker, the opposition I received on this bill was from those persons over 65 that have the smaller tires and they feel safer with the studded tires. They would like to keep their studded tires until they wear them out so that is what the amendment does.
