SENATOR MARESH: Roll call vote.

CLERK: Senator Koch voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, roll call vote is requested. Call the roll. You all understand the issue now. All legislators please be in your seats. We are under Call. We are under Call. The Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote taken. (See page 1007, Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Legislature is still under Call. Please take your seats.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. The Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Maresh. He wants to withdraw that? Okay. Mr. President, Senator Venditte would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte.

SENATOR VENDITTE: I would like to take up that particular kill motion. Would we still need the necessary votes to suspend the rules?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to make a motion to suspend the rules to take up the kill motion? You need thirty votes.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Well, my veteran Senator from Scottsbluff says lay it over so I think we had better do that. I think, Mr. Speaker, it would allow more of the members of the Legislature to be here when we vote on this tomorrow.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair will ask once more that those who have meetings scheduled while we are in session, I urge you to please reschedule because we will go through this constantly otherwise. Now so the bill is laid over. We will try one more bill and see what happens. LB 618. If we have this problem again, we just as well adjourn.
