SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, truly technical amendments. Somebody left off the word "institutions" I think and that is one of the things, lending institutions, so we get that cleared up. The other part has to do with S & Ls. I don't know how it got put in there but as I understand the confusion that apparently S & Ls could go into the banking business without any usury rates at all on unsecured loans so we are correcting that. After this, then Senator Lamb has an amendment. Just for the record to find out where we are, how many more amendments are there?
