an introduction like that. LB 730, LB 730 requires members of nominating commissions to take an oath of office and the oath had some language in it which was in the bill at the outset to conform to a provision in the bill that we amended out on General File, so inasmuch as we amended out one provision of the bill, I have to change the oath a hair and what I am doing is striking the word "all" in line 15, page 2 of the bill and substituting, therefore, the word "only", and what that will mean simply is that when the commission member takes the oath of office, the oath will read to the effect that he shall send to the Governor the names of only those persons he believed are qualified to be judges as opposed to the names of all persons he believes to be qualified to be judges. A simple change done to conform to previous action of this Legislature with this bill. I move the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion of the Johnson amendment to LB 730? Seeing none, hearing none, the motion then is the adoption of the Johnson amendment to LB 730. PRESIDENT: Motion to advance the bill to E & R for engrossment. Any discussion? All those in favor of advancing LB 730 to E & R for engrossment signify by saying aye, opposed nay. LB 730 is advanced to E & R for engrossment. We will now go to LB 689, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are E & R amendments to LB 689.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.
