Senator Fitzgerald, would you let Senator Chambers listen for just a minute please? I would like to point out that the physician's assistant operates in the State of Nebraska under the control of a doctor, a specific doctor, and if a physician's assistant does anything that proves to be wrong, it is not the physician's assistant that is responsible, it is the doctor that is responsible and these physician's assistants are trained for their specific area that they are designed to do and that is to assist the physician in the examination of patients but they cannot do anything without being responsible directly to the doctor that they operate under, that they are licensed under. Now it seems to me, and I understand the concern that Senator Simon and Senator Chambers and other people have for the young people involved in boxing, but it seems to me that if we take this philosophy, where are we going to stop it. In rural Nebraska, we could say in essence that a physician's assistant cannot be the one that is present at a football game, basketball game, rodeo or what have you and it is going to tie up the physician when there is only one for a good number of people in that town. Now I am sure that is not what Senator Simon is attempting to do here but it could be a step in that direction. To say that a physician's assistant is not responsible is not being exactly truthful it doesn't seem to me because of the fact, and I emphasize again, the physician's assistant cannot make a move without jeopardizing the doctor that he is responsible to. All we are saying with the physician's assistant's program is that it is an attempt to expand the number of people that a doctor can serve and I think these people are well qualified and I think the doctors that have a physician's assistant assigned to them have been handling the physician's assistant in a very responsible manner, and for Senator Simon or anybody else in this body to indicate that they are not responsible, that they are not doing a good job, in my opinion is very wrong.
