SENATOR COPE: Senator Carsten, is there a penalty now if a new home you build or a new bin or something isn't reported to the assessor of the county?

SENATOR CARSTEN: I am not positive but I think there is. I think that that is true. I think that it is in operation, that there is a penalty assessment.

SENATOR COPE: But I am sure that it wouldn't be the twelve percent that is in this bill. If there is, this has been increased.

SENATOR CARSTEN: No, and there is also a provision for a forgiveness also and I am not sure how much or how many actually have had to pay a penalty but there is a forgiveness in the statute also.

SENATOR COPE: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the Vickers amendment to the Vickers amendment on LB 689. Senator Vickers, are you going to close on your amendment to your amendment?

SENATOR VICKERS: No, I would just simply point out that the amendment to the amendment is just inserting the word "new" in irrigation wells so that we are dealing with a new well, not a replacement well.
