SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Burrows amendment to 918. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? We are voting on the Burrows amendment to 618 (sic.) Once more, have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Burrows. A Call of the House has been asked for. All those in favor say aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All senators will take their seats. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. Please check in. Would you please check in? Senator Haberman, would you check in please? Senator Schmit, Senator Hoagland, Senator Stoney. Senator Burrows, did you want a roll call vote?

SENATOR BURROWS: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: A roll call vote has been asked for. I think everyone is here but one. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on pages 1168-1169 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Burrows amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion lost. Do you have any more amendments?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, what is the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Beutler. (Read Beutler amendment found on page 1169 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I will try to be quick. Essentially what the amendment does is, it says that the participating ranchers will be paying one half instead of one third of the share of the cost so the breakdown would be one half by the rancher, one sixth by the state government and the remaining one third by the federal government.
