and a half and ten and a half cent tax in 1979 purchases only three point seven cents for that amount. So I think it is important that we look ahead. We are going to keep on having fewer gallons burned and the fuel continue to go up. I think we need to plan ahead so our highway construction continues, our streets maintained, the county bridges can be repaired. I move that the amendment be adopted.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Maresh amendment to the amendment. It only takes a majority of those voting. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted?

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: It requires a majority of those voting. Have you all voted? Record. Senator Newell, for what reason do you rise?

SENATOR NEWELL: Could we have a roll call vote?

SENATOR CLARK: We can have a roll call. It hasn't been announced yet. A roll call vote has been asked for. Call (mike off).

CLERK: Roll call vote commenced.

SENATOR CLARK: I think we are under Call, aren't we? Do you all want to check in? We will know how many is here. Have you all checked in please? Senator Landis. Senator Koch, will you check in please? Senator Murphy. Senator Dworak. We are still short six people. Do you want to go ahead with the roll call? Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call continued. 19 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President. (See page 1204, Legislative Journal.)
