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in the manner in which it was intended. I think that when you talk about....

PRESIDENT: One minute, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT:when you talk about these kind of contributions, we raise a whole new issue. For example, suppose that I want to confuse or cloud Senator Kahle's campaign so I send him an anonymous contribution of a hundred dollars, and then I watch for it to show up in some local charity and it doesn't show up there, and then I say to the local press, I gave Senator Kahle an anonymous contribution of one hundred dollars and it did not show up anywhere. It is my word against Senator Kahle's word. And I think that this opens up another area which can be more confusing than the present area. I think before.... I am willing to listen to the proposed amendments, but I believe we should do one of two things, either not pass the bill or definitely delay the enactment date until January of 1981.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, a question of Senator Hoagland, if he would respond, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR STONEY: Senator Hoagland, when the motion was made, I don't believe that I was able to distinguish how many sections would be affected by your amendment. Could those be restated? I know you explained the change in 19 and I appreciate that. I believe they mentioned 5 also, and were there two or three others?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes. Yes, here is the approach we are taking, Senator Stoney, is we are striking five sections... 5, 14, 17, 19 and 24, and we are striking new language. We are striking a change in section 21, and that change is contained on line 20 and 21 of page 28. And our whole theory about this is, that if we have any question or any doubt about these changes, let's simply strike the sections or strike the changes because that reinstates current law. So for all the substantive changes basically we are simply saying current law is good enough. For the housekeeping changes that are important to make and that have worked their way through the legislative process over the last two years and that all kinds of parties have been involved in through the summer and the fall, we are saying let's go

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
