SENATOR HOAGLAND: Okay. Excuse me, Mr. Speaker, let me go back to...9 is probably necessary. All right, now the following sections are good...good changes.

SENATOR KELLY: Fellow members, then this bill that was flunked on Final Reading, that was reconsidered, put back on Final Reading and which now we are going to amend by dropping some sections and changing others, but by the introducers and the promoter of the bill, the only thing that is absolutely necessary that needs to be done would be section 1, 2, 3, 4, 18 and 25. With that in mind, should we be going to do surgery on LB 535, should it not be that we would return this for an amendment that would leave only those absolutely necessary sections in the bill and remove all other items from the bill. If this is not the proper procedure, probably we need to send it to a diagnostic center whereby we can find what it is we should do. But, again, as I have stated before regarding some of these substantive changes, it is awful difficult to wash a mud puddle.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would just like to say at this time, we are only debating the return of this bill. That is why all the question about division would come down the line only if it is returned. So I wish we would restrain our speaking to the matter of, shall we return the bill. Otherwise, all of this is for naught, and the Chair is going to state right now that if it is returned, I am going to leave up to the Speaker the time in which that will be
