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and there is no reason for that.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, thank you, Senator Fowler. This is a real concern I have due to the geography of Nebraska, as you all know, it has some wide open spaces and right now with the system we have where the county attorney, one of the doctors usually in the community and some other official form a coroner's board and are able to react almost immediately to a problem in an area. I would guess that this might take days or at least a number of hours before you could get these officials to the scene, especially under adverse weather conditions. The other thing...I have a feeling on this whole bill and I know we are talking about the amendment now, but that we have overreacted to an isolated case. I think generally our coroner system, our investigation of deaths has worked quite well. I am sure there will be arguments to the contrary but I feel in my own area it has been handled well, quick and efficiently. The case that we are concerned about, of course, concerned error, human error, if there was. You are not going to avoid human error no matter how you try and even with the professionals you still have a chance of human error. The other thing that...I believe it is the very next bill that is coming up, would give our county attorneys more training. I have had some misgivings about this bill but I am ready to support it. I think this extra training would help our county attorneys in this field also. So I oppose the amendments and also the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, there is an amendment to the Kahle amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers moves to amend the Fowler, Landis, et al amendment. (Read the Vickers amendment to the Fowler amendment as found on page 1293 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Whose amendment is this?

CLERK: I think Senator Vickers.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. Speaker and fellow members, as I was indicating earlier, my concern in this matter is that we are creating an agency and then letting the agency make the determination as to whether or not they should be used.
