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you a chance to be on both sides of the issue. When you are talking to so-called conservatives, yes, I voted for a lid. Then when the people come who want additional programs that make and not be implemented because of the lid, you can say, well the Legislature put the lid on it. I would be for the program but we don't have the money to fund it. So I think we ought to all have our feet put to the fire and we should be made to face the mistake as I view it that was made when those lid bills were passed. There was such haste involved that a serious blunder as later on it was labelled occurred, with reference to the number of votes it would take to remove a lid. So that legislation was not well considered and if I remember correctly some of it was passed during a special session. Senator DeCamp, is that right, and you can just nod and was the session called to review the criminal code or do something like that?

SPEAKER MARVEL: You have thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, so the whole thing was not well ordered and should not have occurred. So rather than vote in favor of Senator Burrows' kill motion, we should dispatch that very quickly, then consider removing the lids altogether. I am opposed to his kill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I rise to oppose the Burrows motion. I apologize for my voice but I am still going to try to make the points necessary. Senator Chambers has articulated the position quite clearly. There are a number of us that certainly have no problems in terms of lid legislation because we never supported it to start with. One of the big mistakes this Legislature made was not to adjourn sine die the day I made the motion when we first came down here for political purposes for putting on lids. I think there is time that we discuss it and I will have a handout for you before the end of the day in terms of what we are really talking about. Deception Senator Burrows says comes from this body in terms of controlling expenditures. The deception really is that we are spending at a greater rate than the locals are. We talk about how much aid we send to local subdivisions. We are not going to increase that very much this year. Most of the money will go, of course, to running the state and the University and if you look at that little book that we looked at yesterday when we passed those overwhelmingly, that most of the agencies of government in this state and the University and the state college will be in excess of 10%. Some will go to 13% but we are going to turn around and say, now listen, this Legislature,
