ASSISTANT CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1461 and 1462 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 44 ayes, 1 nay, 3 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The bill is declared passed on Final Reading. Okay we will go back now to LB 853 and there is a motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Goodrich moves to return LB 853 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment is on page 1289 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body, there is an amendment in the Journal but over the weekend in discussions with the packing industry in Omaha and some attorneys in Omaha for the packing industry, we have come to the conclusion that the amendment that is printed in the Journal should be changed. So, consequently, I am going to ask that we pass over this bill so that...in fact, I just got the amendment...the new wording of the amendment and I have not had an opportunity to give copies of it to Bernice and to Senator Schmit and that sort of thing. I am going to ask that we pass over this bill for today. Wait until tomorrow, in other words, so that I can distribute copies of the new amendment so that we can... and Bernice and Senator Schmit and I can discuss it before we actually take it up.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any objections? Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Yes, I do object. I would prefer that we just lay it over for maybe an hour or so and still take it up today. The reason I am saying this, I have many people that came down from the area that is involved in regard to this amendment that I had passed the other day to 853. I would prefer that he give me the amendment now and that we come back to it later today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay....

SENATOR LABEDZ: I am sure it is not that much involved where we can't discuss it today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objections, so ordered. The bill will be passed over temporarily. Senator Venditte.
