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out that compares the salaries, the Nebraska salaries on there are the new salaries so you can see compared to other states they are low. I do support the amendment and as far as the conservative part of it, I can stand up here and not be ashamed to support this amendment when I look at the money that is being spent on the green sheet on the back for some other programs. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Rumery, your light is on.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, I would like to call for the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate ceases. Senator Hefner, do you want to close on your amendment?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, Mr. President. Mr. President, members of the body, I am proud to introduce this amendment. There is nothing to be ashamed of. The salaries of our patrolmen aren't that great and let me emphasize once again, all the patrolmen are not getting the 11% increase of the salaries that we are paying to all the state employees. It was mentioned about the brown bag lunch. I have just been informed that it is a policy of the State Patrol that they cannot carry a brown bag lunch. They have to go into a restaurant and eat when they are on the road. They have also got to be visible at all times and I just want to call that to your attention. Another thing I want to say is that private businesses allow this. We allow it in our business. If an employee is on the road during meal time, that we will pick up the tab. I think that is only fair and I can see why Senator Chambers would oppose this. He has always been against the patrolmen, probably always will be but there again let me emphasize to you, I think this would only be fair and just to help our state highway patrolmen out. I urge you to support the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the ...yes.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. Chairman, I would like to have a Call of the House before we vote on this.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.
