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SENATOR KEYES: Yes, just for clarification from Senator Warner. Senator Warner, you say it is fully funded. Now this \$66,000 that you gave, is that within the seven percent bounds of what we gave to those departments of extension last year, and this hundred thousand, how much will that put us over the seven percent or could you answer that?

SENATOR WARNER: Senator Keyes, there is no individual program anywhere within the budget that was arrived at by an arbitrary seven percent. When I stated fully funding, we fully funded the request for additional extension agents as requested by the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources. Now they may have had additional needs as Senator Kahle has pointed out. All I am indicating is that we did put in the full amount for the positions that were requested.

SENATOR KEYES: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Kahle, when we give them \$66,000 that they asked for, and, Senator Warner, I think you have heard what he has said about it, now you are coming along and asking for \$100,000 more which is almost twice as much as they asked for above what they got. Now, extension, I can realize that my daughters will need to know how to cook, if that is what you had in mind, how to prepare food, but do you feel that we are justified in a time in which...I just come from talking with hundreds of people and I am telling you they are so sick and tired of taxes it is pitiful and then we come along and give to the department almost twice as much as they asked. I can't understand it, Senator, and maybe you would care to comment on it.

SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, I sure would. You have not heard the whole program and I am sure that the University was very hard put to make up a budget that they thought the Legislature would buy but there were I believe some seventy requests for extra additional help in the extension department so they pared it down a great deal. I saw the list of those that have asked for help and I am not asking that, some seven hundred thousand dollars, I believe it would take to fund all their requests, but in studying this over and looking at it, it looks to me like if we are going to help ourselves in this crisis that we have and that we are going to have, we have lost a great amount of the skill that we once had, Senator Keyes, you and I, how to butcher and preserve meat and the canned vegetables and our wives have lost, the young wives especially, have lost a lot of that skill, and I think for self-preservation we are going
