SENATOR SCHMIT: I think I would rather stick with unidentified flying objects. I think, Senator Kelly, being an old pilot, there have been some times when we are flying in the fog and the overcast, Senator Kelly, that certainly an unidentified flying object might be you or me in a different object of aircraft but I think that at this point in time I think to expand the project such as this, to put \$7,500 into this kind of a project, when hundreds of millions of dollars are being spent across the United States, not only in the research, but in the chasing and so forth, I think is a good indication, is an excellent indication of how small seeds and small acorns grow into mighty oaks and I am curious also, was this a University request or did the committee add it by popular demand?

SENATOR KELLY: Senator Schmit, you mentioned that I am an old pilot and that is correct and you are also aware that in the flying business we state, there are old pilots and bold pilots but there are no old bold pilots and I claim that classification. This program, Senator Schmit, is a collection of information in the paranormal range of human understanding, human ability, put in with the folklore program at the University of Nebraska-Omaha for \$7,500 in a \$653 million budget and please leave it alone.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator, you know that is a very touching plea there and I normally acquiesce to any of your requests and I have done so many times in the last eight years but what does the committee anticipate, and to you I apologize because you seem to gravitate to be the spokesman for the paranormal, but what does the committee seem to anticipate from this study?

SENATOR KELLY: What we would anticipate with this, Senator Schmit, would be a filing cabinet and a part time clerk in the University of Nebraska-Omaha library system that works in the folklore archives that would receive this information from scientists throughout the state, throughout the region, and collect that in that filing cabinet for dissertation, doctoral studies in the area. That is what it would be used for.

SENATOR SCHMIT: How much money do you anticipate spending for the program next year?
