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taxpayers dollars paid for. Surely they weren't very much but here we are only spending \$7,500 and I am not concerned about breaking the hold that the Appropriations Committee has on us or not breaking it. It's okay but I think going back to your home town or your home area and saying, yes, I voted for \$7,500 for Paranormal, whatever it is, and this I think has to do with UFOs. Well let me say that the federal government has spent plenty of money on UFOs and various things of this nature that I don't think we want to be spending even \$7,500 for such trivia as this. SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers, do you wish to speak to the Schmit amendment?
