SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, you have time for one more question.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Warner, do you have any idea over the past ten years how much the tax support for, the Nebraska tax support for higher education has increased?

SENATOR WARNER: I can get that to you shortly, but I would imagine that the increase in higher education is fairly consistent with the total increase that the budget has had for the simple reason that the proportionate share that goes to post secondary education remains fairly stable in the area of 24%, give or take a half each way.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Just for the record the Nebraska tax support for higher education, which is the University, has increased 212% in the last ten years, but the national average is only 207%. So the fact is that we are one of the states that are going backwards is not true, Senator Warner. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, are you ready to advance the bill? Is this 1002?

SENATOR WARNER: 1001.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance LB 1001 to E & R, oh, is that where we are? Should we start over again? The motion is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye. We are voting on the committee amendments to 1001. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. . .oh, the amendments are adopted. Now, are we ready?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp now has an amendment to the bill. (Read DeCamp amendment).

SPEAKER MARVEL: Unanimous consent is requested to withdraw the bill, or the motion?

CLERK: Yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objections, so ordered.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.
