PRESIDENT: All right, let's have a roll call vote. Everyone return to your desks here. The House is under Call. Let's proceed with a roll call vote. The question is the Koch amendment to LB 1002. Proceed with the roll call vote.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have got a request to reread the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, reread the amendment.

CLERK: (Reread Koch amendment found on page 1520 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Proceed with the roll call.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 1520-1521 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. May we have the next amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Hefner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hefner, all right. Do you want to read the amendment or...Senator Hefner?

CLERK: Would you like me to read it, Senator?

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Hefner amendment reads as follows: (Read Hefner amendment as found on page 1521 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President, members of the body, I passed out this amendment yesterday afternoon, late yesterday afternoon. If you will turn to your bill #1002, page 19, I am adding \$80,000 in General Fund money to the Crime Commission fund and this would be for the assistant of any law enforcement agency that is located on a reservation. These would be reservations that have not retroceded from state jurisdiction. Our state Crime Commission used to get LEAA funds for this and then they would help fund the police protection on these Indian Reservations, however, this federal program was discontinued a year ago. It was just a three year program but the Nebraska Crime Commission said they
