Number two, functionally and operationally the way that this sits, there is a lot of gray clouds between the Department of Alcoholism and the Educational Department. We are asking the Educational Department to get involved. The money stays with the alcoholic people but the meshing there doesn't seem too practical to me. This does not mean that \$1,000,000 is transferred to the Department of Education. I understand that. I hope everybody else understands that but I think that operationally it is going to be difficult and I don't like the mandating of the \$1,000,000 specifically because it takes a big chunk of their operational administrative funds and what we are doing, we are stepping in and we are managing the department for them. I don't know that it is the intention of the Legislature to step into any department and manage it for them.

PRESIDENT: Senator Powers, you are now discussing the amendment itself. We want to stick to the, if we can, to get finished with the Koch amendment to the amendment.

SENATOR POWERS: Oh, I endorse the Koch amendment to the amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, fine. Senator Murphy and I believe this is the last speaker and then Senator Koch will close.

SENATOR MURPHY: I most certainly would endorse the Koch amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Koch, any closing? No closing. The question is the adoption of the Koch amendment to the Murphy amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: All right, motion carries. The Koch amendment to the Murphy amendment is adopted. Senator Murphy, you may now...are there further...Senator Kahle, do you want to speak to the Murphy amendment as amended?
