

youths and have permission from the courts or from their parents or from somebody, we are just whistling Dixie because you cannot interfere with a family that is disciplined or whatever it might be. If you don't believe that why, try banning smoking in our schools. We provide the place for them to smoke. So I think that Senator Murphy has the right idea. I think we should go in this direction. I do not think it should be mandated. I think we should let the Department of Alcoholics run their show, at least another year until we find out where they are headed. I think we ought to talk to the education people about it and see if they will allow the alcoholic people to come into the schools and work. We do really have a problem and I think we have a legal problem because as long as that child or youth is a juvenile they are under their parents care, not the State of Nebraska or the school system. It is too bad it is that way in some cases but that is the way it is. So I urge you to defeat the Murphy amendment and let's work on the subject as a whole and not try to force something before it is time.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes. All right, Senator Murphy, will you close then on your amendment.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well I think the issue has been quite well addressed and I hope, I hope that these two departments function as we are directing them to function and if they do not, I hope next year the Appropriations Committee will make appropriate recommendations about the budgets for those people. It is unfortunate that we have to follow these people in this manner but with an expenditure of \$6,000,000 in the state with DPI with a total budget, if you will, of \$73,000,000, if \$1,000,000 dedicated to a very critical problem in any way impairs a \$73,000,000 budget, then we have more problems than even I think. I would move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question before the House is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to LB 1002. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted?

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. President, could we bring in the Executive Committee?

PRESIDENT: Yes, I guess...yes, we should go under Call. We would like to get this wound up because you are going...

SENATOR MURPHY: I would move that we place the House under Call, Mr. President.
