- which should direct us as we proceed and it is on page 4 of your rule book, it is Rule 1, Section 12 and, first of all, you can only speak once and, secondly, Senator Labedz, this is the way the question is directed in the rules and this is the question before the House, shall the Chair be overruled? And that is the question you wish to pose, is that right, Senator Labedz?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Right.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, you understand the question, shall the Chair be overruled? All those in favor...all right, I wanted to be certain on the language. It says, shall the Chair be overruled? Needs 24 affirmative votes to overrule the Chair so if you want the Chair overruled you vote aye, if you are in favor of the Chair you vote no. All those in favor, yes, sir. Go ahead, Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, if I am in order, I would like to throw in my two cents worth on this issue.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Chair recognizes you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would urge very strongly that everybody support the Speaker in this issue. Please, please, look at the process now and what we are doing to the process and don't look at the substantive matter because that is not the real question here. There is an old concept from biology which I think I remember correctly about parasites and the animals that they live in, live on, and the animals that they live on are called "host" animals. What you are doing to the legislative process right now is creating the possibility of a host bill. Let me predict what is going to happen if you allow the Speaker to be overruled today. What is going to happen is that every year, year in and year out in this Legislature, one or more persons are going to fish out an obsolete statute and have a bill on an obsolete statute and that bill is going to bounce along up to Final Reading and then all of a sudden this great vacuum is going to be created and this great sucking power is going to come from this bill and the lame and the crippled, the bills that are dying, bills that are already dead, bills that have never even been introduced are going to start attaching and there is not going to be any way to stop them and we are going to be up here debating them and the whole session, everything that we have rejected the whole session, everything that has been weeded out throughout the whole process will be before us once again. Look at the itmes that are presently on the
