So we wind up taking those positions that come back to haunt us later on. I would submit that there is more involved than just the district elections. Who controls the Legislature, as Senator DeCamp very well pointed out, may very well be before us today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it is not who controls in terms of the body but who controls in terms of promising to deliver something even if it means suspending a multitude of rules. So before this debate is over, I want to get a copy from the Clerk, I won't ask him to read it, of all the rules that you are being asked to suspend but, remember, you won't be able to discuss it fully, you won't be able to add amendments, you won't be able to offer motions, and the Speaker is denied the right to send it to a committee for a public hearing. The whole process is being made a mockery of and I am totally opposed to Senator DeCamp's motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Mr. President, I, too, would oppose the suspension of every rule in the book it seems. The unique motion that is drawn up to have a special procedure for one bill. Senator DeCamp says that the only way something controversial passes is to suspend the rules. The fact that this bill is law, the fact that this bill became law without a suspension of the rules obviously proves that false. Senator Labeledz gives a fine, fine talk, wraps herself in martyrdom and says, just give me one chance to vote on the bill. I would be a lot more sympathetic if Senator Labeledz had chosen the route that was available to her, that is available to every Senator several, several weeks ago to file a motion to bring the bill out of committee, place it on General File which is where debate should start, not on Final Reading, but that motion wasn't put up. No one offered that motion. No one several weeks ago when there was time to debate the issue filed the motion to bring it out. I don't know why not. I had heard that perhaps some people didn't feel there were the thirty votes necessary to bring the bill out. We now find ourselves on Final Reading where the sponsors of this bill need thirty votes to suspend all the rules. They have had an opportunity, the rules provided an opportunity. We don't need to rewrite the Rule Book to give the sponsors
