SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Senator Keyes, do you wish to be recognized on the motion?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. How...don't it have to lay on E & R for one day before they can take it up again, or are we on the suspension of the rules yet. It's not on Final Reading. It has come back from Final Reading to E & R, I believe.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What's his question? Do you want to state your question again?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. Does the bill that failed this morning, doesn't it have to have...lay over until tomorrow before we can discuss it again if it fails?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, if I understand your question on the motion to reconsider, if it is put to the vote and it fails, the bill is dead. Is that your question?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes. Now they can't bring it up today. They have to wait for how many hours....

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, you can bring it up right now. We are considering it right now. Does anyone else wish to speak on the motion? Senator DeCamp, do you want to speak on the motion?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I will just close whenever....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Can I ask...there are three lights on that I think should be taken off. Senator Newell...Senator Newell, Senator Cullan. Your light is on, do you want to... okay. Senator DeCamp, the Chair recognizes you to close on the motion for reconsideration.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, the bill is dead. It takes 30 votes to reconsider. Since it has already been read, if it were reconsidered, at that time we could immediately vote on whether it should or should not be passed. It is my understanding that the bill had adequate support on both portions that are involved in the bill, all the way across, and that basically the part that apparently there was some controversy in involving Senator Lewis and Senator Keyes that they changed the dates so that they could accommodate both of those people. So I think the bill is a legitimate one that should be reconsidered and should be passed. The other part is basically noncontroversial...the Haberman part about school buses or some doggone thing, and the only reason it
