CLERK: I have nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? Has everybody voted that wants to vote? Have you all voted? Senator Newell, do you want to....

SENATOR NEWELL: Go ahead and....well, no go ahead and count the vote and we will just....it's not an important amendment anyway.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Clerk record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Haberman. The motion is to kill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: It is just that simple, Mr. President. I move to indefinitely postpone this bill. Let's lay it over. We are tired. We have been here a long time, and let's get on with it. I call for a vote. Besides that, Mr. President, I don't think we need two homestead bills. We have already got one....exemption bills.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We have four lights on. Can I find out.... Senator Johnson, do you wish to speak to the kill motion? Okay.

SENATOR JOHNSON: I think that, Mr. Speaker and members of the body, that a kill motion at this time on this bill is premature. I think that we can easily come to regret a kill motion. LB 608, and mind you, LB 608 in my opinion being a member of the Revenue Committee was probably the bill that the Revenue Committee preferred.
