Senator Newell would like to print amendments to LB....

SENATOR CLARK: Is that all you have?

CLERK: Well, Senator Newell would like to print amendments to LB 882. (See pages 1633 through 1637 of the Legislative Journal.) Series of amendments to 882, and an amendment to 882A. (See page 1637 of the Journal.)

SENATOR CLARK: Is that all you have?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President.....

SENATOR CLARK: Wait a minute, Pat. I would like to introduce to the Legislature seven students from Chappell, Nebraska, from Senator Haberman's District. Sue Miller is the teacher. They are in the north balcony. Will you stand so we can recognize you, please? You want to take up the Labeledz amendment?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Labeledz moves to return LB 1529 to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the Schmit amendment. Is that the effect? I am sorry, return 999. It's on...the Labeledz amendment is on page 1529 of the Journal. Okay.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Labeledz.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. I wasn't present at the time we were voting on Senator Schmit's amendment, which was striking the \$7500 that the Appropriations Committee put in for the UFO project of Senator Kelly. Senator Kelly asked me to introduce the motion and I consented and I will turn it over to Senator Kelly to explain why he thinks this is very necessary.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Nichol. Senator Kelly, first please.
