SENATOR STONEY: Senator Carsten, I think that there would be but I, to be quite candid, I couldn't say specifically but I would be more than happy to gain that information, and if it creates a technical difficulty if the bill would advance, I would address that on Select File.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Stoney, do you want to close on your amendment?

SENATOR STONEY: Well, Mr. Chairman, I think there is a technical difficulty with this particular amendment and the problem being the committee amendments were not adopted, this addressed the amended version of the bill coming from committee, so in its present form it is not technically correct. So I would ask that it be withdrawn at this time.

SENATOR CLARK: It is withdrawn. Is there another amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Burrows moves to amend the bill. The Burrows amendment is on page 1124 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: What was the page number?

CLERK: 1124, Senator.

SENATOR BURROWS: I believe that was to the Standing Committee amendments so I will withdraw that. I don't think it is in order as to apply to the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is from Senator Keyes. Senator Keyes moves to amend the bill: Read Keyes amendment as offered on page 1664, Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I want all of the Senators to listen and pay attention to what I am going to say because this is truly something that I have not supported in the past but today I will tell you why I am going to support it. I probably was one of the first ones with Senator Dworak to put a limit on property taxes but today the limit bill that we have has done nothing but raise property taxes ten, fifteen, twenty percent, caused us because of the way the bill was written the last time to raise the taxes ten
