SENATOR WARNER: Mr. Clerk, they should be divided. I have two sets.

CLERK: Yes, sir, you do. One is on 931 and one is on 939, Senator, of the Journal I am talking about. Okay?

SENATOR WARNER: 939?

CLERK: I guess they are both on 931, Senator, my mistake. They are both on 931, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Oh, yes, they are both there.

CLERK: I misled you before.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, I misunderstood you. There is one amendment marked number two, number one, I mean?

CLERK: One, yes.

SENATOR WARNER: Okay, I will move adoption of that. This one is not controversial, believe it or not. All this does, it clarifies the language as to the fee that is to pay by the tracks and I think the wording in the bill could at least be interpreted that the...I think it is \$400 that could be interpreted for the season of each race meet and it is intended to be without question per day of the season at each track and the rest of it are nothing but necessary amendments to...well strikes the original section, original committee amendment number three which isn't needed the way it is written. It could be an E & R amendment but there is nothing controversial about it so I move its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the first Warner amendment to LB 939. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Are you ready for the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Warner now moves to amend. This is the second Warner amendment found on page 931.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move adoption of the amendment. I wouldn't have done this so late in the day but since the tracks have had two lobbyists working all day at least we ought to make the effort of adopting the
