as a competitor of the lessor or seller when the effect of such lease or contract for such sale or such condition, agreement or understanding may substantially lessen competition or tend to create a monopoly in any line of commerce." Again, all these provisions are now applicable to most industries in the state and the thrust of this amendment is to simply make them applicable to the motor vehicle industry. Thank you.
