

five hands? Okay, all those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate ceases. Senator Hoagland, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker, I have a brief closing here I would like to just make a couple of remarks in conclusion. Senator DeCamp earlier asked us to come up with a body of evidence to justify this. He said, what is wrong with the way the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board is currently operating? Well I suggest that anybody who asks that question hasn't read the report and anybody who asks that question hasn't read the committee amendments and haven't read a lot of these amendments that we are proposing now and anybody who asks that question, what is wrong with the operation of the Motor Industry Vehicle Licensing Board or the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board didn't attend the committee hearings before the Appropriations Committee or the Public Works Committee and I suggest that anybody that asks that question hasn't had the kind of experience that Senator Johnson has had who is down there in the trenches as an attorney on a day to day basis defending people and helping people who have been dealing on a day to day basis with the used car and the new car dealers in this state and it was come to the same conclusion that the Federal Trade Commission has come and that is that the biggest problem consumers have in our society today is dealing with people that sell them automobiles. Now what has happened today is strangely reminiscent of what happened on Monday of last week, eight days ago. As a matter of fact I have a feeling of deja vu. That takes me back to the water debate because you know I came down here at eight o'clock this morning ready to negotiate and to meet with some people from the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board and their representatives and new car dealers and they decided they didn't even want to negotiate. They didn't call the meeting off or anything. They just decided they weren't going to show up because the steam roller was set up. They had the votes and they were going to come chugging right down the center aisle of this Legislature, once again demonstrating that it is the upper house, not the lower house that calls the shots and makes the decisions on our alleged Unicameral and we came down here at eight o'clock ready to talk about this bill and nobody came in to talk to us because evidently they had it all figured out.
