SPEAKER MARVEL: You have thirty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It would help me if I could find it within myself to line up with some of these kind of lobbyists and just have a bill that will fly on its own but sad to say I will never be in that position. I am opposed to Senator Cullan's motion. I don't think we ought to suspend the rules and I don't think the senators ought to be beaten down because the Speaker, pardon me, Senator Marvel, trying to be editorial, the Chairman of the Executive Board or any other committee stands up and expresses displeasure. We all should speak out for ourselves, defend ourselves but most of all, make sure that the votes we cast are in the best interest of the people of the state and in this particular instance, in the best interest of the Legislature and I think we ought not to suspend the rule.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit. Senator Schmit, where did you go? You don't want to speak, okay. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There are no...Senator Nichol. There are no additional people who wish to speak so, Senator Cullan, do you wish to close on your motion?

SENATOR CULLAN: Very briefly, Mr. President, I think the issue here is, and I agree with Senator Beutler, that this Legislature should be very serious about suspending the rules and, Chris, I believe that your amendments were sincere and I am not trying to stifle that kind of debate but it is three fifty in the afternoon. There are other General File bills that...bills on General File that we need to get to. This bill will be on Select File and if there are amendments offered there we can meet them at that point in time. Almost all of the issues that were raised it appears to me, have been offered in the amending process and it would serve us no valuable purpose to continue this debate at this point in time. It would appear to me that any further amendments would be only for the purpose of delay and I think that that simply is not a procedure that is expedient or wise at this point in time. So I would hope that you would vote to suspend the rules.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the suspension of the rules to vote on the advancement of the bill. Is that right,
