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sixty day session is not as much time as a ninety day session. I think we just have to realize we are not going to be able to achieve as much as we would like. There are things on General File on that list I would very much like to see over on Select File but I think we have to realize there is a point at which within sixty legislative days we can't handle everything and I think that if we can say that we have dealt with lids, state aid, homestead exemption, energy, personal property tax, the state budget, plus numerous other smaller bills, I think that is a pretty good accomplishment. I don't think we need to suspend the rules and move my ten most desired issues across nor Senator DeCamp's. I think we can continue working in the way that the Speaker has laid out. I think we can debate issues fully and completely. I don't know what Senator Nichol's amendment are. I don't know what a lot of these things that are included in the DeCamp motion and I guess I would like to know what they are before I vote on them. So I would oppose this effort to suspend the rules and I would also indicate I am probably not going to offer my alternative but I think any one of us could put together our list and give a very very good case as to why those are the log jam issues and those are the ones that must be passed. But I think we have done pretty well so far. I don't think we need to suspend the rules.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would ask for a ruling from the Chair with regard to the form of the motion. It seems to me that this kind of a motion should be out of order because it doesn't specify the rules being suspended. I don't believe...it is one thing to say to suspend a specific rule, it is another thing to say to suspend all pertinent rules. Who knows what pertinent rules are? The motion should be rejected for vagueness. I would ask a ruling from the Chair as to whether it is proper to have a motion to suspend the rules where the specific rules being suspended are not designated.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, do you have any comments before the Chair rules? The Chair isn't going to waste much time.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Sure do. The previous ten years that I have been here this has been a customary motion and I can take you back at least a thousand times and show you in the record. I specifically say any pertinent rules and I specifically outline a procedure. That is not that unusual.
