PRESIDENT: If the two of you are in agreement with that I have no reason not to go along with it. We will take it up as soon as Senator Marsh's other motions are finished.

SENATOR NEWELL: Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: That is agreeable to the Chair.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you. Mr. President. . .

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Continuing on page 1668 starting with the name of Harold Dwyer to the Manufactured Housing and Advisory Board; Linda Jaeckel, Board of Parole; Phil Kaldahl, Public Employees Retirement Board; Robert Krohn, Advisory Committee to the Department of Economic Development; Betty Lof, Commission for the Hearing Impaired; Dr. Robert Rosenlof, State Board of Health; Tod Voss, Rural Health Manpower Commission; Mike Carr, Nebraska Oil and Gas Commission; Betty Matz, Advisory Committee to Public Welfare Institutions and Corrections; E. A. Olson, Environmental Control Council; and Beverly Steskal, Committee for the Hearing Impaired. The Committee on Committees moves for the adoption of those names.

Motion then is the adoption of the Marsh motion to adopt, to confirm the names submitted by Senator Marsh and just described to you. Any further discussion? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.
