

into. It is strictly a technical amendment and does nothing substantive with that language that was adopted the last time we discussed 361.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Landis amendment to LB 361. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the Landis amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries, the Landis amendment is adopted. Now since we are waiting for the Speaker we will be at ease until the Speaker gets here. The Chair is advised that there is one more amendment to the bill. Mr. Speaker, we are addressing the question of whether or not we should pass over LB 361 at this point. We adopted the Landis amendment, we took up 361, adopted the Landis amendment and are awaiting the Hefner amendment and then Senator Fitzgerald stated that you would prefer that we go ahead and take care of 722, I believe it is.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I think, Mr. President, that the original order of those two bills is as it appears on the worksheet today. I think the understanding was that there would be an attempt to try to meld the two together and I visited with Senator Warner and also Senator Fitzgerald. I think that it would be easier, if the Legislature doesn't object, to taking up 722 and then attempting to take up 361 after that.

PRESIDENT: All right so your order then changed to take up 722.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: So we will leave 361 on Select File and move on to LB 722. Senator Hefner, unless you want to object to the Speaker's

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes, Mr. Chairman, I object to changing these around. I think we ought to go as the order was given to us last evening.

PRESIDENT: Are you formally objecting to the change of the Speaker's orders?

SENATOR HEFNER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Anyone wish. . . do you wish to say any more on the. . . you are moving then to overrule the Speaker's change of order.
