SENATOR DeCAMP: They're flowers.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I asked for a ruling from the Chair.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, I'm going to allow Senator Johnson to speak first, Senator Haberman, and then the Chair will make a ruling. I haven't made one since yesterday.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, Mr.....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to overrule that?

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, but you just make it two against one and that ain't fair.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well, you two against me isn't fair. Is that what you mean? Okay, Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Well, I'm just going to speak very quickly. The amendment would delete statute 39-6191. LB 651 amends 39-669.07. So we have got the same chapter. LB 651 deals with the rules of the road. The amendment itself deals with liability concepts from using the road. So not only...not only are we talking about the same chapter, but in addition we are talking about a related subject matter. On both scores germaneness, whatever that means, applies.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, may I answer that?

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair is not...you can speak to the Chair. You can't speak back and forth. Go ahead.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, I want to speak to the Chair.
