LB 651

SENATOR HABERMAN: The green sheet there has authorized court imposed alcohol treatment at expense of persons convicted of driving while intoxicated. Now that to me has nothing to do with the guest statute or who is riding with you or anything else, and so I ask the Chair to rule that the amendment is not germane to 651.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, to be consistent with what was done on LB 741, the Chair rules that it is not germane.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Where are we on LB 651?

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, I have an amendment from Senator Dworak now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak, you have an amendment to 651.

SENATOR DWORAK: Well, Mr. President, if Senator DeCamp's amendment wasn't germane this one certainly is. So I would urge the adoption of this amendment which is a compromise between Senator DeCamp's amendment and closer to the original bill, and essentially what this does is keeps the guest statute in Nebraska up to the second degree of consanguinity or affinity and I move the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Where is the amendment? Senator Beutler, did you wish to be recognized?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I believe Senator Haberman has....

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I ask for a ruling that this is not germane to 651. It does the same thing. It works on the guest statute and I ask for the same ruling. It's the same song, second verse, Mr. President. I just turned the record over.
