SENATOR HABERMAN: I will have to withdraw that now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: No objection, so ordered.

CLERK: I've got nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I move that LB 628 as mangled be advanced.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I would like to ask a couple questions of Senator DeCamp if I may, a couple questions? I notice you are taking an interest in the bill, 628, didn't you have an amendment to it?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I was just wondering if you support the bill in its present form.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I think so. Is there a trick?

SENATOR BEUTLER: No. There was just an interesting provision in here about...it has to do with the penalty if they don't go to school and it says it is a month's salary and it says, "Each month upon which such violation occurs shall constitute a separate offense." I was wondering if you were supporting that provision also.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh, separate offense?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, but that is in with the bill so I have to take it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Oh, so you are consistent between this and your water bill position.

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am the most consistent person you will ever find, especially when I know I am being trapped.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of the advancement of the bill say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 959.
