SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am tempted to try to agree with Senator DeCamp but I would have to agree with the Chair. I do believe the Chair is in order and I would support the Chair's position. I am perfectly willing to take whatever time is necessary to proceed step by step, item by item through all the procedure and I think that there will come a time unfortunately, Senator Newell, when there won't be enough of a quorum here to vote on anything but that might not be all bad either and so I would say that I will support the Chair and I think we have very little alternative.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, are you finished? The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy who is next on the list to speak. Do you wish to speak to the motion which is overruling the Chair? That is the motion before the House.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. Speaker, I move we adjourn until nine o'clock Monday morning.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, it is not debatable. All those in favor of...you moved to adjourn until when?

SENATOR MURPHY: Nine o'clock Monday morning.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to adjourn to nine o'clock Monday morning. All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed...machine vote has been requested. All those in favor of the motion to adjourn vote aye, opposed vote no. Excuse me. How many are excused? Five are excused.
