SENATOR KEYES: I think we ought to have a Call of the House then.

SPEAKER MARVEL: A Call of the House is requested. The motion at the motion is to adjourn and there has been a request for a Call of the House. Shall the House go under Call is the motion. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 5 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, record your presence. Senator Fowler, Senator DeCamp, Senator Goodrich, Senator Barrett, Senator Stoney, Senator Kelly, Senator Carsten, Senator Fowler, is Senator Fowler here? Senator Fowler and Senator Goodrich. Mr. Sergeant at Arms, we need Senator Fowler and Senator Goodrich. We need Senator Goodrich, Ray. Everybody is here but Senator...who asked? Senator Murphy, everybody is accounted for except Senator Goodrich. Do you wish to proceed? Do you want a roll call? The roll is being called on adjournment. Those in favor of adjourning vote aye, those opposed vote no. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1818 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 24 nays to adjourn, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. The motion before the House is Senator DeCamp's motion to overrule the Chair. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled?

SENATOR NEWELL: ...(mike not turned on immediately.) ...
...who called the question did not have the floor.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Well I haven't recognized Senator Cullan, Senator Newell. I am proceeding on the basis that we are ready to vote on Senator DeCamp's motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR NEWELL: I have my light on, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I'm sorry, but Senator DeCamp has the floor.

SENATOR NEWELL: Somewhere you said I could speak on this issue.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, proceed.
