

go into the physical examination to prove almost every other year that they are still physically disabled and unable to work. As I said before there are many, many that have a condition whereby they are not able to work and the children and the husband or the parent of one way or the other are under Social Security. In most cases they are in worse shape than those that are over 65 because nine times out of ten they are still paying off their home. Now we do have these people, some of them having to go under ADC or also they are under food stamps, welfare, yet they are trying to maintain their homes but because of the disability will probably never work for the rest of their lives. Now the amendment that Governor Thone suggested covered even the low income, those that were unemployed. This would just take those under Social Security. Now believe me there are a number of people out there that do have some disability that are unable to pay their property taxes and have to move out of their homes. I am asking that at least this much be given. I don't know what the cost would be because we don't have the figures available, but it would not be as much as the amendment that we just defeated by Senator Warner's amendment. It would just take care of those people that are under Social Security that are physically disabled and probably will be the rest of their lives that have no way of paying their property tax, no way of maintaining their homes because as I said before in most cases they haven't even had their home paid for yet. At least the elderly over 65, in most cases their homes have been paid for. When you are paying off a mortgage and the mortgage payments are high and you are under Social Security because of a disability I believe that we should include all, not just the mentally disordered. SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, we are now speaking to the Labeledz amendment to the Wesely amendment, to the Hoagland amendment, I'm sorry. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Labeledz, I guess I don't understand all of the implications of your amendment. You are saying that it applies to all disabled. Have these amendments been passed out?

SENATOR LABEDZ: No, my amendment was not passed out and I don't believe that Senator Hoagland's was either. Senator Hoagland's just covered those under Social Security with mental disorders. Mine would cover all under Social Security regardless of age, but they would still have to meet the income guidelines. For instance if the husband had a stroke and was physically unable to work, but the wife was working they of course would not come under it because
