SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye, opposed vote no.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker, I withdraw my...

SENATOR CLARK: I would ask a question of you. Does this take a suspension of the rules to only go fifteen minutes?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, yes, sir, it takes a rule suspension. You want...

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, you will either have to withdraw your motion or...yes, will you withdraw your motion? We need a rule suspension if we proceed.

Obviously, Senator Warner and a few others want to speak and I will allow them to do so but in answer to my good friend, Mr. Haberman, if there is a bill on Select File that he hasn't read yet, he hasn't been doing his homework and I don't need to offer a whole bunch of amendments now because I can tell you right now I will vote for each one of those bills on Select File without a whole lot of additional debate and I haven't seen any profound amendments offered yet today.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, the Clerk is going to work up the wording which would have to do with the suspension of the rules, and meanwhile we will proceed with Select File, so we won't lose any time, and when we get that we will come back to it.

SENATOR KOCH: Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, will you please alert the Legislature as to a motion that you would like to put after LB 954A. Can I have the attention of the Legislature (gavel)? Senator Warner, has the floor.
